The SBL Greek NT: a Comparison with Five Editions

The apparatus to the SBL Greek NT presents the evidence of five different editions in addition to the readings of the SBL GNT text. Those editions and their abbreviations¹ are:

- WH = Brooke Foss Westcott and Fenton John Anthony Hort, *The New Testament in the Original Greek*, vol. 1: *Text*; vol. 2: *Introduction* [and] *Appendix* (Cambridge: Macmillan, 1881).
- Treg = Samuel Prideaux Tregelles, *The Greek New Testament, Edited from Ancient Authorities, with their Various Readings in Full, and the Latin Version of Jerome* (London: Bagster; Stewart, 1857–1879).
- NIV = the Greek text behind the NIV translation, as presented in Richard J. Goodrich and Albert L. Lukaszewski, A Reader's Greek New Testament (Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 2003).
- RP = The New Testament in the Original Greek: Byzantine Textform 2005, compiled and arranged by Maurice A. Robinson and William G. Pierpont (Southborough, Mass.: Chilton, 2005).
- NA = the NA^{26-27}/UBS^{3-4} editions, which all print the identical Greek text. (NA is explicitly cited in the apparatus only when it differs from NIV.)

The apparatus documents, in 6,928 variation units, all non-orthographic² differences between the SBL GNT and the texts of the five listed editions.

A comparison of the SBL GNT with each of the five editions represented in the apparatus reveals the following patterns of agreement and difference³:

SBL agrees with NA:	6381	SBL disagrees with NA:	547

A comparison of the SBL GNT with the four editions consulted in the process of compiling the edition (WH Treg NIV RP) reveals 56 differences; if the comparison base is widened to include the five editions represented in the apparatus, the number of differences declines by ten⁴:

² That is, the apparatus does not note differences between the editions that are judged to be solely a matter of orthographic variation, or that involve only elision, crasis, movable v, interchange between first and second aorist verb endings, and so forth; see further the section on "Orthography and Related Matters" in the "Introduction," pp. xii-xiii.

Similar comparisons of each of the other editions against the others reveal the following differences:

In analyzing these data, please keep in mind that they represent only part of the overall picture; they do not take into account, e.g., instances where a variation-unit involves three or more variant readings. Nor do they take into account the type, character, or quality of the places where the various editions differ. In short, they offer an introduction to, but not a full picture of, the nature of the differences between the SBL GNT and the five other editions.
